Lectures by Bernhard Gál

Alongside his concerts and exhibitions, Bernhard Gál gives lectures and workshops, concerning his own work as well as general subjects of the contemporary music and art practice (sound installation, music & architecture, music & language, soundscape composition, etc.) and regularly participates in panel discussions and artist talks. 'Sound installation art' was also the subject of Gal's lecturing at the University of Arts in Berlin in 2006-07. 2010-13 Gál held a research position at the Paris Lodron University Salzburg, in conjunction with the interdisciplinary doctoral college 'Art and the Public'.

Gal gives insights into his creative process and presents selected intermedia art projects / sound installations, electro-acoustic or instrumental compositions. Topics and perspectives of his presentations vary with the audience (i.e. art and music professionals, university students, school classes, exhibition and concert visitors).

'A brief history of sound installation art'

Sound art is a relatively young art practice, a time-based artform between traditional categories, integrating concepts of contemporary music, visual art, architecture or other forms of creative expression.

A sound installation can be regarded as an expansion of the concept of installation art, adding the element of sound, and thus stressing a focus on temporal perception. The audience is offered an opportunity to thoroughly explore the installation space, and particularly the placement and movement of sound in space. Many sound installations are site-specific, they may be conceived for closed and for open spaces, often establishing a dialogue with the surrounding architectural and acoustic environment. Some installations make use of interactive technology (computers, sensors, mechanical and kinetic devices, etc.), others present pre-recorded sound projections from loudspeakers exclusively, or just acoustic sound sources.

Sound installation artists often extend their interest from sound-only works towards the creation of multi-disciplinary works, hence employing intense sensorial interactions. The placement of sound in space gains significant importance, sometimes suggesting parallels to architectural strategies. The site-specific arrangement of acoustic and visual objects often results in an extensive physical experience of sound and a re-evaluation of one's own sensorial system. Well-known sound installation artists include Rolf Julius, Christina Kubisch, Bernhard Leitner, Robin Minard, Max Neuhaus, and Bill Fontana.

'Beyond categories - Intermedia Installations by Bernhard Gal'

Sound Installation Art has become one of Bernhard Gal's main areas of interest, and was also the subject of his lecturing at the University of Arts in Berlin in 2006-07. Since 1998, Gal has presented around 70 installations and intermedia art projects on four continents. He also works in collaboration with the Japanese architect Yumi Kori ('audio-architectural installations'). As a musicologist, curator and advocate of sound art, Gal has given lectures and workshops at various educational and cultural institutions across the globe. His installations revolve around interactions of sound and light, site-specificity, time-space correlations, as well as the perceptual and sensorial preconditions of aesthetic experiences, and 'the human condition' in general.

Bernhard Gál - Biographical Note

Austrian artist, composer and musicologist Bernhard Gál is equally at home within the domains of contemporary music, installation art and media art. As of now, Gál has created around 80 sound installations and intermedia art projects, combining sound, light, objects, as well as architectural concepts and video projections into multidimensional and prevalently site-specific art works. He also composes music for acoustic instruments and electroacoustic music. As a laptop musician he has been performing extensively on five continents. He also serves as the artistic director of the Austrian art organization 'sp ce'. Between 2006 and 2007 he taught sound art at the University of Arts in Berlin. 2010-13 Gál held a research position at the Paris Lodron University Salzburg, in conjunction with the interdisciplinary doctoral college 'Art and the Public'. For his music and art projects Gál has received numerous awards, his music has been made available on ca. 30 audio publications.
